What a Great Success!!!

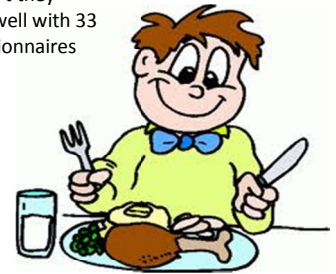

On Saturday, January 15th, Unit 91 held a **Membership Drive and Auxiliary Burger & Dogs Grillin' day** at the Post. Information for Legionnaire, Auxiliary, and Sons of the American Legion membership was available. THANK YOU to Barb, Becky, Gina, Christine, Mary, Glenn White and Mark Hopf for helping with this event.

Valentines were signed by Auxiliary members and will be sent to "Project Angel Hugs," a faith-based organization that provides support to children with cancer and their families.

Unit 91 is finalizing our collection and purchasing of items for **StandDown 2011**, February 4-6 at the Veterans Coliseum in Phoenix. I will give a detailed report in the next newsletter. For those that are reading this before those dates, volunteers are still needed. Please go to www.arizonastanddown.org and click on volunteer registration. From my past involvement with this event, helping a homeless veteran is a rewarding experience. The Department of Veterans Affairs has

set a goal of ending Veteran homelessness within 5 years. As an organization with 2.5 million Legionnaires, 850,000 Auxiliary members, and 300,000 S.A.L. members, we could help in this endeavor.

Vicky Zwall, Auxiliary National Executive Member, presented a **Field Service In-Service**. Field Service is volunteering directly with a veteran. These hours are collected and tallied by the Auxiliary and pins are awarded for hours served. This in-service is not geared just towards Auxiliary members but to the Legionnaires and S.A.L. also. One item of interest was that these hours are important as a Legionnaire. The Legion National Commander gives an annual report to Congress in which he reports the number of Field Service hours performed by Legionnaires. These hours help to influence increases in VA funding for each State. If there are more members interested in receiving this in-service, just let me know and I will arrange another date. The Auxiliary will be purchasing

supplies for Erie School to help them get through the remainder of the school year. Erie has been the focus of our annual School Supply drive for some time now. Unfortunately, this Title I school will be converted to a charter school in 2012. The Auxiliary will be seeking another deserving school to donate to.

Unit 91 has several big projects coming this spring. Some of these projects are a **booth at the Ostrich Festival** in March, **Poppy Sales**, **Operation Military Kids Day Camp**, and support of the **USO**. We will need volunteers in many capacities. If you have not been to an Auxiliary meeting lately, please join us on the first Thursday of every month at 6:30pm. Well, it's been a busy month for us since the last newsletter, but before I elaborate, I want to take this opportunity to thank the members of the A.L.R. for all their dedication and hard work. You people are stepping up and really making a difference. Because of you, we are able to give to the Veterans and their families who need our help. And a big thanks also to members of Post 91. Your support of our events help us to be successful.

Our group is growing. We added 7 new members at the January meeting. Welcome to: Jeff Slaboch, Pat Slaboch, Mel Smith, Donna Andrews, Dave Anderson, Randy Bunch and Joseph Papaanni.

On January 22, Post 91, 35 and 39 helped the 855th Az ARNG MP Co and their families celebrate the '855th End of Tour Family Awards Ceremony'. It was held at Post 35. The 855th were deployed in Iraq and returned about 90 days ago. The day started with a short ride by A.L.R. members and about ten of the Guard members who ride. The Guard ceremonies were held from 10 to noon. A meal was served by members of the three Posts at noon. The menu that we put together was steak (cooked to order), chicken cordon bleu, various salads vegetables and desserts and pasta and pizza for the kids. There were raffles for door prizes, collected by the A.L.R. members, and entertainment provided by members of the Guard unit. The 3 Posts had recruiting tables set up with information about the American Legion, Auxiliary, S.A.L. and A.L.R.. It was a good experience being able to work closely with members of 2 other Posts for a common goal.

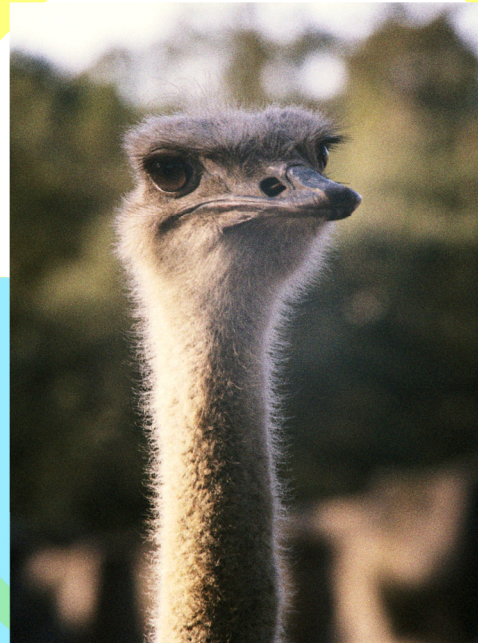
