2011 Poppy Sales

Since joining Unit 91 Auxiliary in January 2011, I wanted to make a commitment to promote the Poppy Program at Post 91. In previous years, Greg and I have visited numerous other American Legion Posts during "poppy" season and we were always happy to see them distributing and promoting the Poppy. And, we were even happier to support them in their efforts. So, it was time to bring that pride into our Post.

By studying for the Auxiliary Leadership Correspondence Course, reading the Auxiliary Handbook and researching ideas on the Auxiliary's National website, I was inspired to create a display that portrayed the true meaning of the poppy – a symbol of remembrance of those servicemen and women who gave their lives for our Freedom.

The poem, "In Flanders Fields", written by Canadian Army Lt Col McCrae, probably inspired me more than anything else I read. His words truly reflect what the poppy has come to mean to us today. That poem is where I got the idea to create "In Flanders Fields" displays, with the Poem and its history behind it. I was given unsold poppies from previous years and utilized approximately 200 of them on the display fields. With some craft sticks, glue gun and spray paint I made the crosses to line between the poppies.

What was exciting is that I realized there were many people who had never read "In Flanders Fields" and didn't understand the significance of the display until they did. I believe it touched them to read Lt Col McCrae's words.

We ordered 400 poppies this year and have collected donations for all of them!. We also asked for donations to add names to the crosses on the display fields. All 60 crosses are now named for friends, family members and loved ones – we even had several people who contributed to add "Unknown" to a cross.

A few weeks ago Bill Quaele (Post 91 Legionnaire) gave me a Canadian Poppy Coin Pin. Well, that gave me another idea! I called Bill and asked if he would be willing to make some of the pins for us to use in our Poppy fundraising efforts. Bill graciously agreed, ordered the coins, added the pins, put them in plastic bags on a display poster, and had them to me within about 4 days. On Wednesday, May 25, we collected donations for all 40 pins within a few hours at the Post. Thank you BILL!

At the writing of this newsletter, we have collected over \$1,026 for the Poppy Fund! Thank you to everyone who supported us!

As directed by the National Auxiliary By-Laws, these funds can only be used for very specific programs for Veterans and Veterans families. While there has not been a final decision made on where it will be donated, I am looking into different organizations that would qualify to receive this contribution.

Unit President Rae Hopf and Past President Barb White took photos of the display and entered it into a Department Poppy Display Contest. The winner will be announced at Convention.

As far as a goal for next year – well I'm already thinking about that because we'll have to come up with something as meaningful as it was to me this year. I hope it was meaningful to everyone else as well!

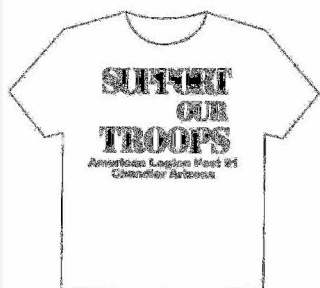

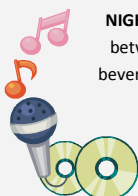

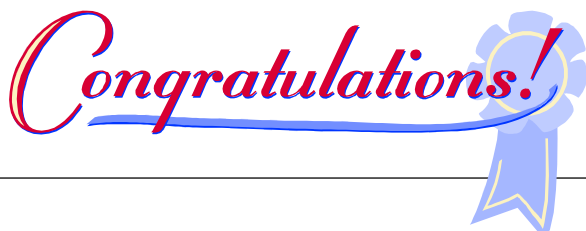
