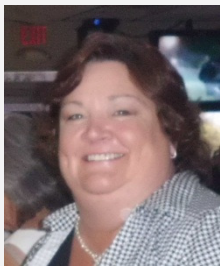
To make this event a success, we will need as many volunteers as we can get. Please start watching for VOLUNTEER SIGN-UP SHEETS to be hung up in the Post.

Unit 91 Auxiliary Donates \$1500 to Sponsor Opening Ceremony Dinner at OMK Pathfinders Camp

As Pat Slaboch mentioned in her article on Page 2, I had the pleasure of attending the opening ceremony and dinner of this year's OMK (Operation Military Kid) Pathfinders Camp in Tucson on July 12th. We used \$1500 of the profits from our Ostrich Festival Booth last April to sponsor that dinner.

The OMK Program (<http://www.operationmilitarykids.org>) provides camps and other programs for the children of Active Duty Military parents. The Pathfinders Camp, which is Arizona's largest and most popular OMK Camp, is focused on military children ages 13-16 who have parents in some phase of deployment. This year, 80 teens from across the state attended the camp. The teens not only get to spend two nights in the dorms on campus at the University of Arizona in Tucson, but they get to network with other teens going through the same challenges that they are being in a military family. During the 3-day camp, which is ran 100% by volunteers from around the State, the teens learn things such as basic first aid from the American Red Cross (since many of these teens often babysit their younger siblings). They learn how to use a GPS by participating in GPS Scavenger hunt games on campus. They not only gain exposure to college life but they are exposed to many different career industries such as Radio Broadcasting, Engineering, Law Enforcement, and Astronomy. They also get to attend stress management, money management, and Americorps Service for Life classes to help them develop Life Skills.

Watching these teens just for one evening was extremely rewarding. Receiving many hugs and "Thank You's" from the teens before and after the dinner we sponsored, and hearing the stories from those teens who had attended the camp the year before and came back for a 2nd year justified in my mind that OMK is a solid program for our Post to continue supporting. Thanks again to all Members who supported our Ostrich Fair Booth last year. For those who didn't have the opportunity, you can start planning now to sign-up to help in April 2012 as we have plans to expand our booth and hopefully even bring in more donations to support OMK.
